among us, Pretty Pony Pastures, a therapeutic riding program set on a picturesque 24 acres in Davisburg, has announced a Hero Appreciation Day and Operation Free Ride from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, May 18. Horses4Heroes is a

nationwide network of family-friendly facilities with equine-related service providers intended to serve active duty mili-tary personnel including service men and women, police, firefighters, first responders, EMS personnel, returning combat veterans and wounded warriors. It also includes critical care and hospice nurses, special education teachers and the families of these heroes.

Operation Free Ride is a one day event intended to give these warriors the opportunity to have a day out with their families and ride a horse for free.

"This is one way to say thank you for the sacrifices they have made for us and our country," said Linda Watson, director and lead trainer. "We've seen the difference riding can make for an indi-

vidual in both therapeutic and traditional riding classes.

Watson is honored that Pretty Pony Pastures was selected to for this project. Those wanting to return for lessons through Horses4Heroes can participate through a discounted once-a-week program.

Although there is no fee for the one day Operation Free Ride event, registrations are required by May 16 by calling 248-634-7276 or emailing register@pretty ponypastures.org.

attending and phone number. Expect a confirmation call. Liability release forms must be signed for all riders. And, plan to bring identification from employment, military or a copy of discharge papers.
All of the riding will

be done in the large indoor arena and available for those weighing 175 pounds or less. This facility uses the large cream-colored ponies with blonde manes and tails known as Halflingers, sure-footed smaller sized horses that are recognized for their gentle dispositions and

a willingness to please. According to Watson, they are not intimidating and are easier for the volunteers to work with.

There are a few things to know before attending. Wear long non-slip pants along with boots or ten-nis shoes. No sandals or open toed shoes, please. Safety helmets will be provided at the farm.

Not only will the day include a basic riding lesson, but expect to learn how to groom a horse and make a few horse treats. Children will appreciate the tov horse races and horse shoe games, too
